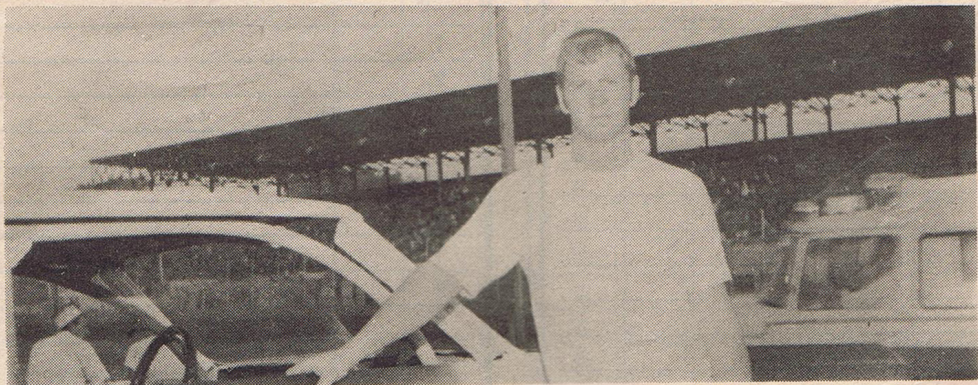




Wayne Diede No. 67, Huron



One of the most promising young drivers in Central South Dakota is Huron's Wayne Diede.

The 23-year old rookie is in his first year of racing on the South Dakota circuit but already his keen knowledge of fast cars and racing ability have tabbed him as one of the drivers to watch in future years.

His 1964 Oldsmobile develops

A veteran of nine years, Miller's Willie Yost is synonymous with modified automobile racing. Yost has been untouchable in most of the races he has run in this season and his little number three modified carried a 302-cubic inch Chevrolet engine with a high-performance Chevy cam, and various other high performance parts.

The point winner at both Huron and Miller, Yost jumped out of his own 03 modified and into the driver's seat of the J & J Auto-sponsored number three vehicle and it was one of the best moves he has ever made. He had driven the J & J Auto cars in two previous years, 1964-65.

During his 1967 stint in the service Willie was still able to race six times, winning five features.

Despite the fact that there are many excellent modifieds in South Dakota which will be running in the feature today, Yost has to be tabbed as one of the clear-cut favorites for a State Fair feature victory.

He is married and has one child.

Ronnie Muth, No. 99, Huron



Huron's Ronnie Muth has become one of the crowd's favorites in the past season for his efforts at both the Huron State Fairgrounds Speedway races every Sunday night and the Central Speedway events on Saturdays.

Muth's number 99 "Old Glory" was a hit the first time it circled the track. Painted in stars and stripes of red, white and blue, the 1967 Dodge R/T has made a big impression against other Class A stocks in the Central South Dakota area.

One of the greatest days for Muth and "Old Glory" came three weeks ago after he won a grand slam at Aberdeen and then took veteran Red Hartford for the feature trophy at Miller the same day. He holds two consecutive victories over Hartford at the Central Speedway, the only person to do so this season.

Muth is currently one of the hottest class A drivers on the track with his 361 cubic inch Dodge virtually throttling past opponents.

Muth is 23 years old, married and has two children.
